

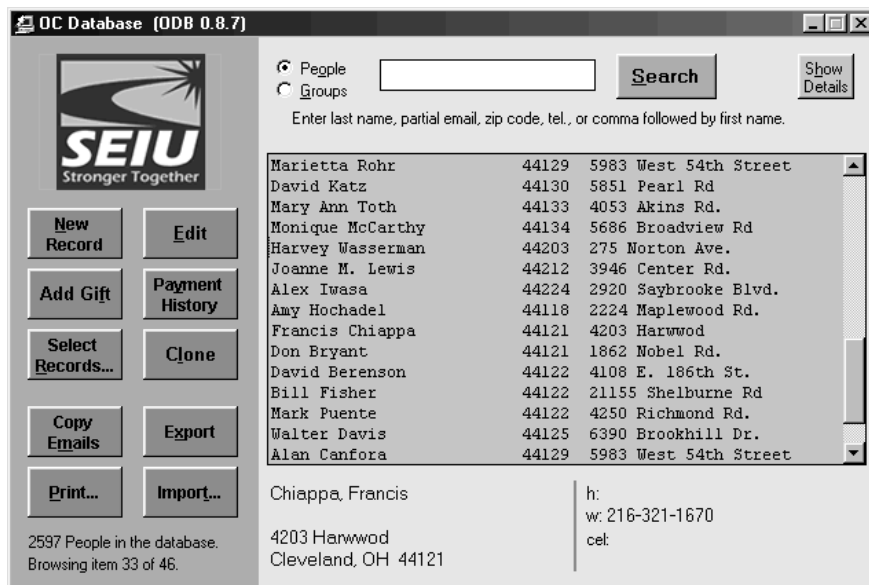
Announcing a free demonstration of a tool for grassroots organizers...

Organizers' Collaborative, a non-profit group based in Boston, has produced a FREE database program for Windows PCs that is geared to the needs of membership groups and grassroots organizing campaigns. This flyer is to let you know that there will be a demo of the ODB (Organizers' Database) software in your area.

This demo will not require any technical expertise; the whole idea of this software is to make databases much more accessible to the social change community. We encourage you to let any organizer who is frustrated with their current database or who is interested in trying something that is easy to use know about this free event.

ODB provides all of the common features you would expect to see in a nonprofit database software program. It makes it easy to enter, sort, print, export, and import lists of people and organizations. It can be shared by multiple users on a Local Area Network. As compared with other free databases for nonprofit groups, ODB excels in ease of use, ease of setup, speed of data entry, and in ability to categorize and select people in your database.

ODB is in use at at least eight nonprofit organizations. It saves all data in a separate database file and automatically backs it up each month. An ODB database is small enough to save to floppy or send as an email attach-

ment. The data is saved in standard MS-Access 97 format, but no Microsoft products except Windows (95, 98, Me, XP, or NT/2000) are required. The software can be updated in less than a minute over a fast internet connection, and in less than 6 minutes via modem. ODB provides a basic zip code lookup feature at no extra cost. **For more info please see <http://organizenow.net/pdf/odb.pdf>**
